### ROADMAP AND PACKAGE OVERVIEW:

You should be reading this file in a directory called: ncurses-d.d, where d.dis the current version number (see the dist.mk file in this directory forthat). There should be a number of subdirectories, including `c++', `form', `man', `menu', `misc', `ncurses', `panel', `progs', `test', 'tack' and `Ada95'. (The 'tack' program may be distributed separately).

A full build/install of this package typically installs several libraries, ahandful of utilities, and a database hierarchy. Here is an inventory of thepieces:

The libraries are:

libncurses.a (normal) libncurses.so (shared) libncurses\_g.a (debug and trace code enabled) libncurses\_p.a (profiling enabled)

libpanel.a (normal) libpanel.so (shared) libpanel\_g.a (debug and trace code enabled)



libmenu.a (normal) libmenu.so (shared) libmenu\_g.a (debug enabled) libform.a (normal) libform.so (shared) libform\_g.a (debug enabled)

If you configure using the --enable-widec option, a "w" is appended to thelibrary names (e.g., libncursesw.a), and the resulting libraries supportwide-characters, e.g., via a UTF-8 locale. The corresponding header filesare compatible with the non-wide-character configuration; wide-characterfeatures are provided by ifdef's in the header files. The wide-characterlibrary interfaces are not binary-compatible with the non-wide-characterversion.

The ncurses libraries implement the curses API. The panel, menu and formslibraries implement clones of the SVr4 panel, menu and forms APIs. The sourcecode for these lives in the `ncurses', `panel', `menu', and `form' directories respectively.

In the `c++' directory, you'll find code that defines an interface to thecurses, forms, menus and panels library packaged as C++ classes, and a demo program in C++to test it. These class definition modules are not installed by the 'makeinstall.libs' rule as librourses++.

In the `Ada95' directory, you'll find code and documentation for anAda95 binding of the curses API, to be used with the GNAT compiler. This binding is built by a normal top-level `make' if configure detects an usable version of GNAT (3.11 or above). It is not installed automatically. See the Ada95 directory for more build and installation instructions and for documentation of the binding.

To do its job, the neurses code needs your terminal type to be set in theenvironment variable TERM (normally set by your OS; under UNIX, getty(1)typically does this, but you can override it in your .profile); and, it needs adatabase of terminal descriptions in which to look up your terminal type'scapabilities.

In older (V7/BSD) versions of curses, the database was a flat text file,/etc/termcap; in newer (USG/USL) versions, the database is a hierarchy offast-loading binary description blocks under /usr/lib/terminfo. These binaryblocks are compiled from an improved editable text representation called terminfo format (documented in man/terminfo.5). The neurses library can useeither /etc/termcap or the compiled binary terminfo blocks, but prefers thesecond form.

In the `misc' directory, there is a text file terminfo.src, in editableterminfo format, which can be used to generate the terminfo binaries (that'swhat make install.data does). If the package was built with the--enable-termcap option enabled, and the ncurses library cannot find a terminfodescription for your terminal, it will fall back to the termcap file supplied with your system (which the ncurses package installation leaves strictlyalone).

The utilities are as follows:

tic -- terminfo source to binary compiler infocmp -- terminfo binary to source

decompiler/comparator clear -- emits clear-screen for current terminal tput -- shell-script access to terminal capabilities. toe -- table of entries utility tset -- terminal-initialization utility

The first two (tic and infocmp) are used for manipulating terminfodescriptions; the next two (clear and tput) are for use in shell scripts. Thelast (tset) is provided for 4.4BSD compatibility. The source code for all ofthese lives in the `progs' directory.

Detailed documentation for all libraries and utilities can be found in the man' and 'doc' directories. An HTML introduction to neurses, panels, andmenus programming lives in the 'doc/html' directory. Manpages in HTML formatare under 'doc/html/man'.

The `test' directory contains programs that can be used to verify ordemonstrate the functions of the ncurses libraries. See test/README fordescriptions of these programs. Notably, the `ncurses' utility is designed tohelp you systematically exercise the library functions.

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zlib 1.2.8 is a general purpose data compression library. All the code isthread safe. The data format used by the zlib library is described by RFCs(Request for Comments) 1950 to 1952 in the fileshttp://tools.ietf.org/html/rfc1950 (zlib format), rfc1951 (deflate format) andrfc1952 (gzip format). All functions of the compression library are documented in the file zlib.h(volunteer to write man



pages welcome, contact zlib@gzip.org). A usage exampleof the library is given in the file test/example.c which also tests thatthe library is working correctly. Another example is given in the filetest/minigzip.c. The compression library itself is composed of all sourcefiles in the root directory. To compile all files and run the test program, follow the instructions given atthe top of Makefile.in. In short "./configure; make test", and if that goeswell, "make install" should work for most flavors of Unix. For Windows, useone of the special makefiles in win32/ or contrib/vstudio/ . For VMS, usemake\_vms.com.

## Notes for some targets:

- For Windows DLL versions, please see win32/DLL\_FAQ.txt
- For 64-bit Irix, deflate.c must be compiled without any optimization. With -O, one libpng test fails. The test works in 32 bit mode (with the -n32 compiler flag). The compiler bug has been reported to SGI.
- zlib doesn't work with gcc 2.6.3 on a DEC 3000/300LX under OSF/1 2.1 it works when compiled with cc.
- On Digital Unix 4.0D (formely OSF/1) on AlphaServer, the cc option -std1 is necessary to get gaprintf working correctly. This is done by configure.
- zlib doesn't work on HP-UX 9.05 with some versions of /bin/cc. It works with other compilers. Use "make test" to check your compiler.
- gzdopen is not supported on RISCOS or BEOS.

#### OVERVIEW======

This package contains C software to implement JPEG image encoding, decoding, and transcoding. JPEG (pronounced "jay-peg") is a standardized compressionmethod for full-color and grayscale images. JPEG's strong suit is compressingphotographic images or other types of images that have smooth color andbrightness transitions between neighboring pixels. Images with sharp lines orother abrupt features may not compress well with JPEG, and a higher JPEGquality may have to be used to avoid visible compression artifacts with suchimages.

JPEG is lossy, meaning that the output pixels are not necessarily identical tothe input pixels. However, on photographic content and other "smooth" images, very good compression ratios can be obtained with no visible compressionartifacts, and extremely high compression ratios are possible if you are willing to sacrifice image quality (by reducing the "quality" setting in the compressor.)

This software implements JPEG baseline, extended-sequential, and progressivecompression processes. Provision is made for supporting all variants of theseprocesses, although some uncommon parameter settings aren't implemented yet. We have made no provision for supporting the hierarchical or losslessprocesses defined in the standard.

We provide a set of library routines for reading and writing JPEG image files, plus two sample applications "cjpeg" and "djpeg", which use the library toperform conversion between JPEG and some other popular image file formats. The library is intended to be reused in other applications. In order to support file conversion and viewing software, we have included considerable functionality beyond the bare JPEG coding/decoding capability; for example, the color quantization modules are not strictly part of JPEG decoding, but they are essential for output to colormapped file formats or colormapped displays. These extra functions can be compiled out of the library if not required for a particular application.

We have also included "jpegtran", a utility for lossless transcoding between different JPEG processes, and "rdjpgcom" and "wrjpgcom", two simpleapplications for inserting and extracting textual comments in JFIF files.

The emphasis in designing this software has been on achieving portability andflexibility, while also making it fast enough to be useful. In particular, the software is not intended to be read as a tutorial on JPEG. (See theREFERENCES section for introductory material.) Rather, it is intended to be reliable, portable, industrial-strength code. We do not claim to haveachieved that goal in every aspect of the software, but we strive for it.

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The Unix configuration script "configure" was produced with GNU Autoconf.lt is copyright by the Free Software Foundation but is freely distributable. The same holds for its supporting scripts (config.guess, config.sub,ltmain.sh). Another support script, install-sh, is copyright by X Consortiumbut is also freely distributable.

The IJG distribution formerly included code to read and write GIF files. To avoid entanglement with the Unisys LZW patent, GIF reading support hasbeen removed altogether, and the GIF writer has been simplified to produce "uncompressed GIFs". This technique does not use the LZW algorithm; theresulting GIF files are larger than usual, but are readable by all standard GIF decoders. We are required to state that "The Graphics Interchange Format(c) is the Copyright property of CompuServe Incorporated."

The best short technical introduction to the JPEG compression algorithm is Wallace, Gregory K. "The JPEG Still Picture Compression Standard", Communications of the ACM, April 1991 (vol. 34 no. 4), pp. 30-44. (Adjacent articles in that issue discuss MPEG motion picture compression, applications of JPEG, and related topics.) If you don't have the CACM issuehandy, a PostScript file containing a revised version of Wallace's article isavailable at http://www.ijg.org/files/wallace.ps.gz. The file (actually a preprint for an article that appeared in IEEE Trans. Consumer Electronics) omits the sample images that appeared in CACM, but it includes corrections and some added material. Note: the Wallace article is copyright ACM and IEEE. and it may not be used for commercial purposes.

A somewhat less technical, more leisurely introduction to JPEG can be found in The Data Compression Book" by Mark Nelson and Jean-loup Gailly, published by M&T Books (New York), 2nd ed. 1996, ISBN 1-55851-434-1. This book provides good explanations and example C code for a multitude of compression methods including JPEG. It is an excellent source if you are comfortable reading Ccode but don't know much about data compression in general. The book's JPEG sample code is far from industrial-strength, but when you are ready to lookat a full implementation, you've got one here...

The best currently available description of JPEG is the textbook "JPEG StillImage Data Compression Standard" by William B. Pennebaker and Joan L.Mitchell, published by Van Nostrand Reinhold, 1993, ISBN 0-442-01272-1.Price US\$59.95, 638 pp. The book includes the complete text of the ISO JPEGstandards (DIS 10918-1 and draft DIS 10918-2).

The original JPEG standard is divided into two parts, Part 1 being the actualspecification, while Part 2 covers compliance testing methods. Part 1 istitled "Digital Compression and Coding of Continuous-tone Still Images, Part 1: Requirements and guidelines" and has document numbers ISO/IEC IS10918-1, ITU-T T.81. Part 2 is titled "Digital Compression and Coding of Continuous-tone Still Images, Part 2: Compliance testing" and has documentnumbers ISO/IEC IS 10918-2, ITU-T T.83.

The JPEG standard does not specify all details of an interchangeable fileformat. For the omitted details we follow the "JFIF" conventions, revision1.02. JFIF 1.02 has been adopted as an Ecma International Technical Reportand thus received a formal publication status. It is available as a freedownload in PDF format fromhttp://www.ecma-international.org/publications/techreports/E-TR-098.htm.A PostScript version of the JFIF document is available athttp://www.ijg.org/files/jfif.ps.gz. There is also a plain text version athttp://www.ijg.org/files/jfif.txt.gz, but it is missing the figures. The TIFF 6.0 file format specification can be obtained by FTP

fromftp://ftp.sgi.com/graphics/tiff/TIFF6.ps.gz. The JPEG incorporation schemefound in the TIFF



6.0 spec of 3-June-92 has a number of serious problems.IJG does not recommend use of the TIFF 6.0 design (TIFF Compression tag 6). Instead, we recommend the JPEG design proposed by TIFF Technical Note #2(Compression tag 7). Copies of this Note can be obtained fromhttp://www.ijg.org/files/. It is expected that the next revision of the TIFF spec will replace the 6.0 JPEG design with the Note's design. Although IJG's own code does not support TIFF/JPEG, the free libtiff libraryuses our library to implement TIFF/JPEG per the Note.

accelerate baseline JPEG compression and decompression on x86, x86-64, and ARM systems. Or such systems, libjpeg-turbo is generally 2-4x as fast aslibjpeg, all else being equal. On other types of systems, libjpeg-turbo canstill outperform libjpeg by a significant amount, by virtue of itshighly-optimized Huffman coding routines. In many cases, the performance oflibjpeg-turbo rivals that of proprietary high-speed JPEG codecs. libjpeg-turbo implements both the traditional libjpeg API as well as the lesspowerful but more straightforward TurboJPEG API. libjpeg-turbo also featurescolorspace extensions that allow it to
compress from/decompress to 32-bit andbig-endian pixel buffers (RGBX, XBGR, etc.), as well as a full-featured Javainterface.
libjpeg-turbo was originally based on libjpeg/SIMD, an MMX-acceleratedderivative of libjpeg v6b developed by Miyasaka Masaru. The TigerVNC andVirtualGL projects made numerous enhancements to the codec in 2009, and inearly 2010, libjpeg-turbo spun off into an independent project, with the goalof making high-speed JPEG compression/decompression technology available to abroader range of users and developers.

libjpeg-turbo includes two APIs that can be used to compress and decompressJPEG images:



TurboJPEG API: This API provides an easy-to-use interface for compressing and decompressing JPEG images in memory. It also provides some functionality that would not be straightforward to achieve using the underlying libjpeg API, such as generating planar YUV images and performing multiple simultaneous lossless transforms on an image. The Java interface for libjpeg-turbo is written on top of the TurboJPEG API.

libjpeg API: This is the de facto industry-standard API for compressing and decompressing JPEG images. It is more difficult to use than the TurboJPEG API but also more powerful. The libjpeg API implementation in libjpeg-turbo is both API/ABI-compatible and mathematically compatible with libjpeg v6b. It can also optionally be configured to be API/ABI-compatible with libjpeg v7 and v8 (see below.)

There is no significant performance advantage to either API when both are used to perform similar operations.

========Colorspace Extensions============

libjpeg-turbo includes extensions that allow JPEG images to be compresseddirectly from (and decompressed directly to) buffers that use BGR, BGRX,RGBX, XBGR, and XRGB pixel ordering. This is implemented with ten newcolorspace constants:

Setting cinfo.in\_color\_space (compression) or cinfo.out\_color\_space(decompression) to one of these values will cause libjpeg-turbo to read thered, green, and blue values from (or write them to) the appropriate position inthe pixel when compressing from/decompressing to an RGB buffer. Your application can check for the existence of these extensions at compiletime with: #ifdef JCS\_EXTENSIONS

At run time, attempting to use these extensions with a libjpeg implementation that does not support them will result in a "Bogus input colorspace" error. Applications can trap this error in order to test whether run-time support is available for the colorspace extensions.

When using the RGBX, BGRX, XBGR, and XRGB colorspaces during decompression, theX byte is undefined, and in order to ensure the best performance, libjpeg-turbocan set that byte to whatever value it wishes. If an application expects the Xbyte to be used as an alpha channel, then it should specify JCS\_EXT\_RGBA,JCS\_EXT\_BGRA, JCS\_EXT\_ABGR, or JCS\_EXT\_ARGB. When these colorspace constants are used, the X byte is guaranteed to be 0xFF, which is interpreted as opaque.

Your application can check for the existence of the alpha channel colorspaceextensions at compile time with:

## #ifdef JCS\_ALPHA\_EXTENSIONS

jcstest.c, located in the libjpeg-turbo source tree, demonstrates how to checkfor the existence of the colorspace extensions at compile time and run time.

=======libjpeg v7 and v8 API/ABI

With libjpeg v7 and v8, new features were added that necessitated extending thecompression and decompression structures. Unfortunately, due to the exposednature of those structures, extending them also necessitated breaking backwardABI compatibility with previous libjpeg releases. Thus, programs that werebuilt to use libjpeg v7 or v8 did not work with libjpeg-turbo, since it isbased on the libjpeg v6b code base. Although libjpeg v7 and v8 are notas widely used as v6b, enough programs (including a few Linux distros) madethe switch that there was a demand to emulate the libjpeg v7 and v8 ABIsin libjpeg-turbo. It should be noted, however, that this feature was addedprimarily so that applications that had already been compiled to use libjpegv7+ could take advantage of accelerated baseline JPEG encoding/decodingwithout recompiling. libjpeg-turbo does not claim to support all of thelibjpeg v7+ features, nor to produce identical output to libjpeg v7+ in allcases (see below.)

By passing an argument of --with-jpeg7 or --with-jpeg8 to configure, or anargument of -DWITH\_JPEG7=1 or -DWITH\_JPEG8=1 to cmake, you can build a version of libjpeg-turbo that emulates the libjpeg v7 or v8 ABI, so that programsthat are built against libjpeg v7 or v8 can be run with libjpeg-turbo. The following section describes which libjpeg v7+ features are supported and which aren't.



Support for libjpeg v7 and v8 Features:-----Fully supported:

- -- libjpeg: IDCT scaling extensions in decompressor libjpeg-turbo supports IDCT scaling with scaling factors of 1/8, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, 3/4, 7/8, 9/8, 5/4, 11/8, 3/2, 13/8, 7/4, 15/8, and 2/1 (only 1/4 and 1/2 are SIMD-accelerated.)
- -- libjpeg: arithmetic coding
- -- libjpeg: In-memory source and destination managers See notes below.
- -- cjpeg: Separate quality settings for luminance and chrominance Note that the libpjeg v7+ API was extended to accommodate this feature only for convenience purposes. It has always been possible to implement this feature with libjpeg v6b (see rdswitch.c for an example.)
- -- cjpeg: 32-bit BMP support
- -- cjpeg: -rgb option
- -- jpegtran: lossless cropping
- -- jpegtran: -perfect option
- -- jpegtran: forcing width/height when performing lossless crop
- -- rdjpgcom: -raw option
- -- rdjpgcom: locale awareness

# Not supported:

NOTE: As of this writing, extensive research has been conducted into theusefulness of DCT scaling as a means of data reduction and SmartScale as ameans of quality improvement. The reader is invited to peruse the research athttp://www.libjpeg-turbo.org/About/SmartScale and draw his/her own conclusions,but it is the general belief of our project that these features have notdemonstrated sufficient usefulness to justify inclusion in libjpeg-turbo.

- -- libjpeg: DCT scaling in compressor cinfo.scale\_num and cinfo.scale\_denom are silently ignored. There is no technical reason why DCT scaling could not be supported when emulating the libjpeg v7+ API/ABI, but without the SmartScale extension (see below), only scaling factors of 1/2, 8/15, 4/7, 8/13, 2/3, 8/11, 4/5, and 8/9 would be available, which is of limited usefulness.
- -- libjpeg: SmartScale cinfo.block\_size is silently ignored. SmartScale is an extension to the JPEG format that allows for DCT block sizes other than 8x8. Providing support for this new format would be feasible (particularly without full acceleration.) However, until/unless the format becomes either an official industry standard or, at minimum, an accepted solution in the community, we are hesitant to implement it, as there is no sense of whether or how it might change in the future. It is our belief that SmartScale has not demonstrated sufficient usefulness as a lossless format nor as a means of quality enhancement, and thus, our primary interest in providing this feature would be as a means of supporting additional DCT scaling factors.
- -- libjpeg: Fancy downsampling in compressor cinfo.do\_fancy\_downsampling is silently ignored. This requires the DCT scaling feature, which is not supported.
- -- jpegtran: Scaling This requires both the DCT scaling and SmartScale features, which are not supported.
- -- Lossless RGB JPEG files This requires the SmartScale feature, which is not supported. What About libipeg v9?-----

libjpeg v9 introduced yet another field to the JPEG compression structure(color\_transform), thus making the ABI backward incompatible with that oflibjpeg v8. This new field was introduced solely for the purpose of supportinglossless SmartScale encoding. Further, there was actually no reason to extendthe API in this manner, as the color transform could have just as easily beenactivated by way of a new JPEG colorspace constant, thus preserving backwardABI compatibility.

Our research (see link above) has shown that lossless SmartScale does not generally accomplish anything that can't already be accomplished better withexisting, standard lossless formats. Thus, at this time, it is our belief that there is not sufficient technical justification for software to upgrade from libjpeg v8 to libjpeg v9, and therefore, not sufficient technical justification for us to emulate the libjpeg v9 ABI.

=======In-Memory Source/Destination

By default, libjpeg-turbo 1.3 and later includes the jpeg\_mem\_src() andjpeg\_mem\_dest() functions, even when not emulating the libjpeg v8 API/ABI.Previously, it was necessary to build libjpeg-turbo from source with libjpeg v8API/ABI emulation in order to use the in-memory source/destination managers,but several projects requested that those functions be included when



emulatingthe libjpeg v6b API/ABI as well. This allows the use of those functions byprograms that need them without breaking ABI compatibility for programs thatdon't, and it allows those functions to be provided in the "official"libjpeg-turbo binaries.

Those who are concerned about maintaining strict conformance with the libjpegv6b or v7 API can pass an argument of --without-mem-srcdst to configure oran argument of -

DWITH\_MEM\_SRCDST=0 to CMake prior to building libjpeg-turbo. This will restore the pre-1.3 behavior, in which jpeg\_mem\_src() and jpeg\_mem\_dest() are only included when emulating the libjpeg v8 API/ABI.

On Un\*x systems, including the in-memory source/destination managers changesthe dynamic library version from 62.0.0 to 62.1.0 if using libjpeg v6b API/ABIemulation and from 7.0.0 to 7.1.0 if using libjpeg v7 API/ABI emulation.

Note that, on most Un\*x systems, the dynamic linker will not look for afunction in a library until that function is actually used. Thus, if a programis built against libjpeg-turbo 1.3+ and uses jpeg\_mem\_src() or jpeg\_mem\_dest(),that program will not fail if run against an older version of libjpeg-turbo oragainst libjpeg v7- until the program actually tries to call jpeg\_mem\_src() orjpeg\_mem\_dest(). Such is not the case on Windows. If a program is builtagainst the libjpeg-turbo 1.3+ DLL and uses jpeg\_mem\_src() or jpeg\_mem\_dest(),then it must use the libjpeg-turbo 1.3+ DLL at run time.

Both cipeg and dipeg have been extended to allow testing the in-memorysource/destination manager functions. See their respective man pages for more details.

For the most part, libjpeg-turbo should produce identical output to libjpegv6b. The one exception to this is when using the floating point DCT/IDCT, inwhich case the outputs of libjpeg v6b and libjpeg-turbo can differ for thefollowing reasons:

-- The SSE/SSE2 floating point DCT implementation in libjpeg-turbo is ever so slightly more accurate than the implementation in libjpeg v6b, but not by any amount perceptible to human vision (generally in the range of 0.01 to 0.08 dB gain in PNSR.)-- When not using the SIMD extensions, libjpeg-turbo uses the more accurate (and slightly faster) floating point IDCT algorithm introduced in libjpeg v8a as opposed to the algorithm used in libjpeg v6b. It should be noted, however, that this algorithm basically brings the accuracy of the floating point IDCT in line with the accuracy of the slow integer IDCT. The floating point DCT/IDCT algorithms are mainly a legacy feature, and they do not produce significantly more accuracy than the slow integer algorithms (to put numbers on this, the typical difference in PNSR between the two algorithms is less than 0.10 dB, whereas changing the quality level by 1 in the upper range of the quality scale is typically more like a 1.0 dB difference.)-- If the floating point algorithms in libjpeg-turbo are not implemented using SIMD instructions on a particular platform, then the accuracy of the floating point DCT/IDCT can depend on the compiler settings.

While libjpeg-turbo does emulate the libjpeg v8 API/ABI, under the hood, it isstill using the same algorithms as libjpeg v6b, so there are several specificcases in which libjpeg-turbo cannot be expected to produce the same output aslibjpeg v8:

- -- When decompressing using scaling factors of 1/2 and 1/4, because libjpeg v8 implements those scaling algorithms differently than libjpeg v6b does, and libjpeg-turbo's SIMD extensions are based on the libjpeg v6b behavior.
- -- When using chrominance subsampling, because libjpeg v8 implements this with its DCT/IDCT scaling algorithms rather than with a separate downsampling/upsampling algorithm. In our testing, the subsampled/upsampled output of libjpeg v8 is less accurate than that of libjpeg v6b for this reason.
- -- When decompressing using a scaling factor > 1 and merged (AKA "non-fancy" or "non-smooth") chrominance upsampling, because libjpeg v8 does not support merged upsampling with scaling factors > 1.

**************************************
Pitfalls***********************************
Restart Markers

The optimized Huffman decoder in libjpeg-turbo does not handle restart markersin a way that makes the rest of the libjpeg infrastructure happy, so it isnecessary to use the slow Huffman



decoder when decompressing a JPEG image thathas restart markers. This can cause the decompression performance to drop by much as 20%, but the performance will still be much greater than that oflibjpeg. Many consumer packages, such as PhotoShop, use restart markers whengenerating JPEG images, so images generated by those programs will experiencethis issue.

The algorithm used by the SIMD-accelerated quantization function cannot producecorrect results whenever the fast integer forward DCT is used along with a JPEGquality of 98-100. Thus, libjpegturbo must use the non-SIMD quantization function in those cases. This causes performance to drop by as much as 40%. It is therefore strongly advised that you use the slow integer forward DCTwhenever encoding images with a JPEG quality of 98 or higher.
